Contacting Office

Our phones have been ringing off the hooks these last several weeks with people interested in our community. We are asking for your patience and cooperation. If no one answers your call, rather than hanging up and dialing back immediately, we ask that you leave a detailed message instead. We will then return your call.

The Office will be closed from 12 Noon to 1 PM. This will allow the staff time to return phone calls and schedule work orders.

We are asking that you do not email staff directly with vacation schedules, maintenance or landscaping items. Staff members could be on vacation or at off-site meetings and do not always have access to their email. Calling the Office and speaking to someone directly (or leaving a message) will ensure your item is addressed.

Items for Maintenance and Landscaping

Many times our staff is approached with maintenance or landscaping items that need to be addressed while they are completing other tasks. While we would like to handle the issue right away, our policy is for you to call the Office to report these items. Your item is logged into our database which allows for proper staff assignment and tracking the status.

Items To/From Attic or Basement

The moving of items to/from the basement or attic will occur every Tuesday. However, we understand certain situations will arise for residents that will require us to respond outside the normal schedule. Whether you desire to schedule a move or have a more urgent need, please contact the Office.

Maintenance Manager

We are excited to announce the hiring of Joe to the position of Maintenance Manager. Joe joined our team on 1/2/2020. He has worked in both maintenance and refurb while employed for SRC. He had also worked in an interim maintenance manager role a few months ago when the position was open.

Joe has many years of experience in both maintenance and management. He has been a wonderful addition to our leadership team. While he has been offered and accepted the maintenance manager position, he is also still working in refurb until we fill his position. We have posted for the refurb/remodel technician position and are working to fill this opening. Joe has great ideas on how to improve this department. We will be waiting until we hire for the open refurb position before implementing the ideas/changes. Thank you for your patience as we transition.

PECO – Power Outages

We received many calls from residents without electric due to a power outage in the area, and some follow up concerns regarding breakers tripped. Our maintenance team assisted residents who had "breakers tripped".

When we contacted PECO about the power outage, we were told to reiterate the following to our residents:

Residents need to report an outage to PECO directly when one occurs. Call: 1-800-841-4141

It is important each resident who is experiencing an outage to call PECO themselves to report it. Perhaps "neighbors can check on neighbors" who might need help calling PECO to report the power being off.

Microwave Ovens We Care About Your Safety!

As a reminder, when using your microwave oven please keep the following safety guidelines in mind:

- Re-heat or cook foods for the recommended times
- Only use dishes labeled as "microwave safe" in your microwave oven
- Using metal and aluminum foil can damage your microwave oven and also create sparks which may cause a fire
 - o Do not put metal dishes or utensils in the microwave
 - o Do not use aluminum foil in the microwave

Locking House Windows

We recommend locking all of your windows for safety purposes as well as energy efficiency. When the windows are locked, it creates a tighter seal on the house, improving efficiency when using your Heating/AC systems.

There is a glass case bulletin board in the library. It is on the wall to the right as you enter the area for DVDs. This bulletin board will be used by the Office to post seminars and information relevant to the Community.

June Pruning/Trimming

Penn Outdoor's crew is scheduled to come week of June 14 (weather permitting) to trim and prune woody plants (such as burning bushes) and evergreens (boxwoods/hollies). Flowering shrubs will be pocket pruned as needed. All others will be trimmed in September.

Chemical Application

Granular chemical application will occur to the lawns on the front, back, and sides of the homes by Penn Outdoor. The chemicals will be applied the end of June or early July (weather permitting). Updates will be placed in the US Mailbox information bins.

Please remain off these areas for approximately 1 day. If your pet goes onto the area, wash their feet as soon as they come inside.

Occasionally Penn Outdoor is required to have signage posted in our Community regarding various services provided. Should you see these signs or markers, please do not remove or relocate them.

As always, call the office should you have any questions.

Front of Home Siding Cleaning Pilot Program

While many residents desire to have the siding of their homes fully power washed annually, it is not something that can be provided as a free service to all residents, due to the finances involved, as well as the staffing time required. The residents' desire for their houses to look clean is understood by the staff. The staff also understands the potential physical limitations of some residents in cleaning the exterior of their homes. With this in mind, a pilot program will be instituted this summer to determine if cleaning of the fronts of homes including porch railings could be done economically with minimal impact on the staff. The pilot program will consist of a few high schoolers who will clean the siding of front porches by hand brushing and use of a garden hose. There will be no charge for this service. While it is understood that some residents already paid for their homes to be professionally powered washed, this process is not expected to result in the same degree of cleaning that comes from a power washer. This program is optional to residents. Should a resident desire <u>not</u> to have this free cleaning performed, it is requested that they call the office by Friday, June 11.

For those who allow the free cleaning, the following are important to understand:

- To be able to perform this task at all the homes at SRC and BRC, time must be limited to approximately 30-45 minutes per home. The intent is to remove as much surface dirt and pollen from the front porch, siding and porch railings within that time period.
- Porch items will be moved only as necessary to clean the house surfaces and railings. The items will not be removed from the porch during the cleaning process.
- The concrete porches and walkways will not be cleaned.
- While special care will be taken to limit the amount of soap and water that flows onto windows, the summer staff will not be able to clean windows resulting from any residue left on the glass due to the process.
- Dawn dish detergent will be used in the cleaning process. Per the manufacturer, the risk of adverse effects on the environment is considered small.
- Spraying of front doors will be kept to a minimum to limit the potential for water seepage into the home.

If a resident is concerned with any of the above, they should opt out of the program.

The program will start on vacant homes. Assuming no problems develop, the cleaning will occur on a section by section basis. Advanced notification of when various residential sections will be cleaned will be made via postings at mailboxes.



Walking, Riding, Driving Safety Reminder

We would like to remind you this is an active retirement community with walkers, joggers, & bike riders.

- Bicycles are allowed on the roadways NOT on the sidewalks.
- Be aware that the resident exiting their garage may not see you until it is too late.
- Be aware of oncoming traffic should you be approaching a turn or intersection.
- There are to be no skateboards or roller blades on our grounds.
- Guests (or guest children with adult supervision) are permitted to ride bicycles.
- Children must be accompanied by an adult when visiting the community center.

Please remind your grandchildren & visitors of the above information.

We have found that there are children (and walkers) on our grounds from neighboring communities. It is nice to know they feel safe in our community. However, we need to keep our residents safe too. Should you observe these visitors causing damage, threatening the safety of our residents, or other activities, do not approach the person. Instead, please call the office (or on-call after hours) to report the incident.

These guidelines help make our community safer for our residents and visitors.



Friendly Pet Reminder

Please be courteous to your neighbors and do not allow your dog(s) to "relieve" themselves on buildings, shrubbery/mulch or lawn ornaments. Pets must be under full personal control of an adult and when outside must be kept on a leash at all times. Thank you for your cooperation.



Ticks

Now that the warmer weather has arrived, your outside activities may have increased. Remember to check yourself for ticks if you were gardening, walking in a park or through wooded trails.

U.S. Mail

Please make sure you are using the entire address on your U.S. Mail. Remember to include your unit number. If you do not include your unit number, the mail may not get delivered to you in a timely fashion or at all.

Occasionally, mail gets delivered to the wrong resident. If this occurs, please let them know you received their mail.





Sewing Club


Sewing Club will meets the 1st & 3rd Fridays of the month at **9:30 AM** in the sewing room on the 2nd floor of the Community Center.
