We are excited to announce we now have a 65-inch flat screen smart tv available for resident use in the SRC Dining Room. Residents have contacted us already with ideas for educational shows, programs, special tv events that residents may want to gather for, etc. Please contact the office if you wish to reserve the tv/dining room. We also want to thank our Anonymous SRC resident for donating funds for this awesome purchase.

Communication

We have received some feedback regarding office communications with our residents. We wanted to share with you that it is our goal to return calls within 24 hours. The return call may not take place on the same day, and could take place on the next business day, but still within 24 hours. If you have a concern, please contact us, we would be happy to listen and assist in addressing the concern.

SRC Bus Transportation update

We wanted to announce that the SRC bus will be used for trips coordinated by the bus committee. We discussed the six foot guideline and masking for our SRC bus; the following was decided:

- Masks are required.
- A release will need to be signed for each trip prior to entering the bus.
- If you do not wear a mask on the bus, you will not be able to participate in the trip.

Potassium Iodide (KI) tablets

We have been in contact with the local organization that distributes the tablets. Once we have secured our supply, information/tablets will be distributed in the internal mail slots located in the Salon reception area.

Residents bringing a guest to play games

Residents are welcome to bring a guest with them to play games, etc. Guests are required to pay any event fees if money for the event is from the resident treasury. Due to limited seating on the bus, guests would only be invited if the trip has seats or tickets available (residents take priority for trips).

Guests must abide by rules. Movie night is the exception to this, due to Copyright laws.

Carol's Memorial

Beginning in October, the "Chat 'n Chew" located in the cafeteria area near the kitchen will be renamed to "Carol's Café" in memory of Carol Dickinson. Carol had a close family tie to the Chat 'n Chew and shared many stories of her days growing up at the Pottstown Youth Center. A plaque and sign will be installed to commemorate the memorial.

We are currently working on the employee photo directory. The directory will be distributed in the internal mail slots located in the Salon reception area.

Staff Update

Scott Huhn has resigned from his Grounds Manager position at SRC. Joe Slavinski, Maintenance Manager, has graciously offered to step in to oversee Grounds, until a permanent Grounds Manager is hired. We ask that all residents continue to call the office with any grounds work orders that may be needed. We thank you in advance for your patience as we start a search for a new Grounds Manager.

COVID-19

Our residents have exhibited great care and support for one another as well as for the staff as we have all had to face the challenge of adapting to the Coronavirus pandemic together. As we approach the cold weather months and witness a rise in positive cases in our area, the increased risk of exposure to our community also rises. The health and safety of our residents and staff remains our priority.

In the event a resident is experiencing symptoms of illness, tested positive for COVID-19, or has been exposed to someone with COVID-19, we ask that residents please:

- Follow CDC guidelines for self-quarantine
- Contact the office NOTE: Any information shared with the Office will be maintained in strict confidence and used only for the purpose of ensuring the safety of our staff and residents

Gutters & Downspouts

The recent rain events have produced an extremely high amount of precipitation in an extremely short amount of time. The runoff from the roofs into the gutters/downspouts are too much to handle during an intense rain event, thereby causing the overflow. In addition, there are gutter guards installed in various locations throughout the community. These also cause a problem for extreme amounts of rain. The gutter guards cannot handle the rush of the water during the intense rain. The gutters/downspouts and gutter guards are designed to handle normal rainfall.

When the gutters are overflowing during the intense rain, there is nothing we can do at that point in time. Please call the office to have a work order placed to have the gutters examined for a clog. The gutter will be checked after the rain event.

Heater Inspections

Beginning in October, our maintenance team will be performing heater safety inspections. The majority of the inspections will take place early morning and entirely in the mechanical room. With the exception of units with heating systems located in the basement and apartments whose mechanical rooms are accessed from inside the unit, no attention at all will be required from the resident.

Dryer Vents

The maintenance staff is scheduled to begin cleaning residents' dryer vents. We will be doing one Court each month. If you experience longer drying cycles or clothes still being damp after a typical drying cycle before your Court is scheduled, please call the office.

If you are not home and are a DO NOT ENTER, a note will be left for you to contact the office to schedule the cleaning. Otherwise, staff will be at each house to clean the vents. A note will be left behind if you were not home and your vent was cleaned.

Watch the US Mailbox information bins for your Court's vent cleaning month.



Fall Maintenance Items

With cooler weather coming, it will soon be time to change your heater return vents and filters. There is a simple way to remember which vents need to be open or closed. For winter, open the bottom vents (to keep your feet warm) and close the top vents. Should you need assistance changing the vents, please call the office to be placed on the list. The maintenance staff will be coming around to change the filters.

You can run your heater before the return vents are changed. The vents only assist in giving better circulation of the heat. We recommend **testing your heater prior to the onset of cold weather**. The staff would appreciate your testing Monday thru Friday from 9 AM to 3 PM and contact the Office during normal business hours with any issues. This will prevent emergency calls to our maintenance staff.

Trash Pickup Reminder

When placing trash out for pick up on Tuesday and Friday:

- Have trash/recycle out by 8 AM
- Place at the end of your sidewalk
 - Avoid placing trash on the porch as other items could also be picked up by mistake
 - If it is not visible, it may not be picked up
- Call the office if you have trouble getting trash to the end of the sidewalk

Hate to Say It . . . SNOW?

Now is the time to make sure we have a copy of your car key for snow removal, especially if you are a new resident or have gotten a new car. Please call the office with any questions.

- It is NOT mandatory to participate with this snow policy.

 Note: Residents who have not provided a copy of their key will be responsible for moving/clearing their own cars.
- A set of your car keys will be kept and locked in our office for our snow crew to move your car at their convenience for plowing.

This year's snow removal contract was awarded to Triton. They are experienced in snow removal at senior living communities. Thank you in advance for your patience and understanding.

Maintenance or Landscape Items

If you have a landscape or maintenance item, please call the issue into the office as soon as you notice it. If you wait, warranty or project timeframes could be missed. Also, by waiting, additional damage could be occurring. It's also easier for our staff to schedule and perform maintenance/landscape issues as they arise and are reported.



Comcast

Comcast visits the community on Tuesday mornings to provide service to our residents. A FEW REMINDERS:

- The service is free to residents with existing Comcast service.
- In order to request service, residents must call the office by 3 PM on Monday with a description of their issue.
- Residents must be home on Tuesday morning when the Comcast technician arrives.


