





Holiday Closings & Trash Schedule

A reminder that the Offices will be closed on:

- Christmas Monday & Tuesday, December 24 & 25
- New Years Tuesday, January 1, 2019

Christmas Week Schedule:

- Trash/Recyclables will NOT BE COLLECTED on Tuesday (December 25).
- Trash AND Recyclables will only be collected once for that week on Wednesday, December 26.

New Year's Week Schedule:

- Trash/Recyclables will NOT BE COLLECTED on Tuesday (January 1).
- Trash AND Recyclables will only be collected once for that week on Wednesday, January 2.
- The regular Tuesday/Friday trash & recycle schedule will resume the week of January 7.

If you must dispose of trash before the scheduled pick-ups, you may use the dumpster at the rear of the Community Center or near the apartments.

A correction on the Home Meal Menu, there will be no meals on December 24. All clubs, events, activities are also cancelled.

Community Center Doors

Typically the doors to the Community Center are locked when the office closes at 4 PM. It has been our practice to keep the doors unlocked during late afternoon or evening resident events. However, for the safety of our residents, it has been agreed to that the doors be locked when the office closes at 4 PM. You will then be required to enter the door code in the vestibule to gain access to the Community Center. Please contact the office should you need the door code.

Home Safety

The holidays can be a popular time to light candles. Please be especially mindful to never leave your home for any duration with a lit candle. Please also use this same consideration when cooking on your stove or in your oven. When leaving a home under these conditions for even a very short time, you run the risk of becoming distracted or maybe even locked out of your home. Blow out all candles and turn off all cooking appliances before leaving your home for any reason.

Also, mechanical rooms are to be free of combustible materials. If you have combustibles in your mechanical room and need assistance in the removal, please call the Office.

SNOW? Yes! It's That Time of Year Again

The basics of the Snow/Ice policy are as follows:

- You must sign a waiver in the Office giving permission to move and clean your car.
- A set of your car keys will be kept and locked in the office for the snow staff to be able to move your car for plowing.
- It is NOT mandatory to participate with this snow policy.
- If you do not participate, please be aware that your car will NOT be moved or cleaned off and YOU will be responsible for moving your car temporarily to a designated parking area on your section map.
- If you do not move your car, then you will be responsible for clearing the snow around your car.
- Every section has a designated area where all cars are to be parked during a snow event. Check your section map for appropriate parking locations.
- The snow removal staff will not scrape ice from residents' vehicles.
- If snow is predicted and you MUST get out on that day, please call by 4 PM at least a day BEFORE the snow arrives to let us know the time you need to leave. The earlier the office knows, the easier it is to coordinate with the snow removal staff.
- If you have a true emergency, for which you need to leave, push your emergency button. Do not leave a message at the office after hours and weekends.
- If your car has already been moved to the designated snow parking area and you need to use it, please let the office know and your car will be put back in your assigned parking spot.
- If trash/recycle day falls on a snow event day, please know that trash/recycle pick-up may be delayed or even canceled.

Snow removal is typically <u>completed</u> within 24 hours once the snow event has stopped. If possible, we will allow nature to work in our favor to melt the majority of the elements, saving time and resources.

Seasonal Maintenance Items

Salt Bags - If you would like to have a salt bag for the winter months, you must call the office to request one. Please do not wait until the day of or day before a snow event to call. Also, please keep your salt bag scoop in the salt bag for collection at the end of the season. If you need a replenishment of salt in your bin, you may refill from the bins at the mailboxes.

Mechanical Rooms - Please be sure that your mechanical room door is closed tightly at all times to prevent any pipes from freezing during the winter months.

Lawn/Garden Décor - Please remember to remove all outside flower pots, chairs, solar lights, flag holders, etc. from edges of sidewalks and driveways to prevent damage during snow removal.

Windows - Maintenance calls have been received regarding residents feeling drafts in their homes. Check your windows to make sure they're latched securely.

Outdoor Holiday Lights - The decorated trees & shrubs around the community are on a timer. Please do not unplug!

Postal Carrier Christmas Gift

For those of you who would like to contribute to a collective gift from Sanatoga Ridge Community to the postal carrier, be sure to get your cash donation in by Friday, December 14th, and we will forward the gift to the mail carrier. If you come into the Community Center after office hours, your donations, marked "mail carrier," may be placed in the mail slot to the left of the office window. Thanks!

Carbon Monoxide Detectors

All homes are equipped with a carbon monoxide detector. It is important to know that the device will beep ONCE if the electric goes out. The device will signal a detection of carbon monoxide by beeping 4 times, then a pause followed by 4 additional beeps. It will repeat this 4 beep signal to alert occupants of the detection. If this 4 beep alert occurs in your home, please leave your home immediately. It is important to call the office or push your emergency button.

- Please enter through the front doors only. If you arrive early, you will be allowed to wait in the vestibule.

- Helpers will be available if you are on a cane, walker or in a wheelchair and you require assistance through the buffet line.
- If you need a ride, the bus will be available.

- If you are sick that day, call the SRC office to have your meal boxed and delivered to you or placed in the "Home Meal" refrigerator in the Chat & Chew as you prefer.

Resident Dues

At the Resident Committee Luncheon, the Resident Committee also collects dues for the following year. The dues for 2019 are \$5.00 per resident. These funds are used for general expenses of the committee and additional money will be used for projects that will benefit the community in general. Resident dues can be put in an envelope with your name and unit number and placed in the box that will be provided at the Luncheon. If not paid at the Luncheon, you may place your \$5.00 in an envelope with your name on it and place it in the mail slot to the left of the Office window.

Dishwasher Detergent

It is recommended that dishwasher users should no longer use liquid or powdered soaps in their dishwashers as they do not dissolve properly. It is recommended to use dishwasher detergent packets instead. It is also recommended running a cup of vinegar every six months to clean out any buildup of detergents or minerals. The cup of vinegar should be placed on your top dish rack. These simple steps will ensure that your dishwasher will work at its peak performance for many years.
