Perhaps by attending this meeting, you will feel better informed about a candidate for whom you may choose to vote. No reservations required.

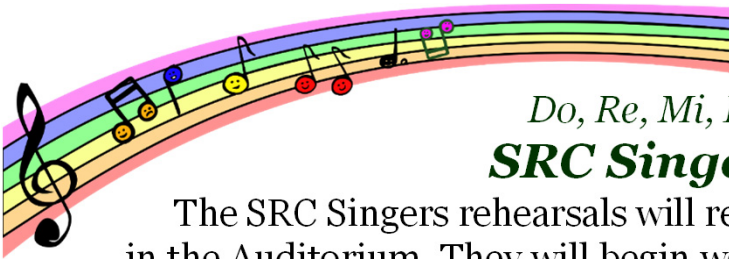

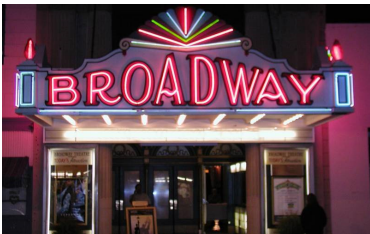

## ***Lunch Bunch***

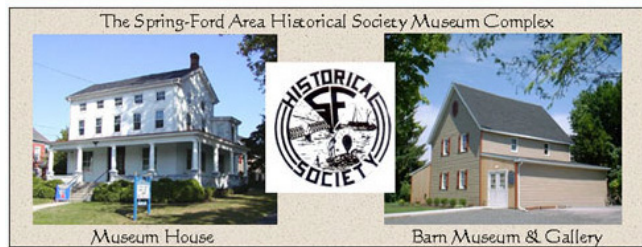

## ***Wii Bowling***

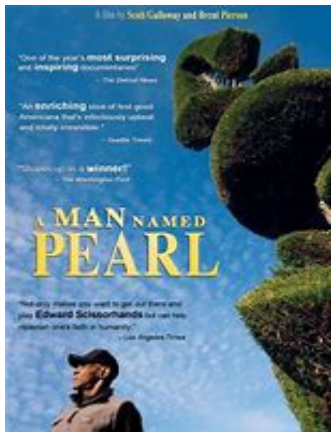
Competition resumes Wednesday, September 19, at 2 PM in the Club Room. We will choose teams and practice.
