In Case Snow Continues . . .

In today's age, weather is reported for a few days out. Usually we hear about a snow event days before it happens. We are asking you to call the office as soon as you can when you hear of a snow event. It does not matter if the event is reported on a Monday for potential snow on a Thursday. Please call the office if:

- You need to get out for an appointment.
- You have caregivers, family or friends coming to your home.
- You need to get out on a regular basis (e.g., working, dialysis, or cancer treatments).

There is an established snow removal plan for the community. We are asking that residents do not assume snow clearing will be done by the next day. Our policy states snow removal will be completed within 24 hours after the snow event has ended. If you have called the office to report your need to have your area cleared based on the above criteria, you are then put on the list to ensure you are out at your specified time.

Be sure to set your clocks **AHEAD one hour.** If you would like assistance changing your timers, please call the office and they will schedule a time for our maintenance staff to visit.

Trash Dumpsters and Recycle Bins

The dumpsters and recycle bins have been relocated to the Maintenance Building. However, for your use, you will find marked containers for trash/recycle:

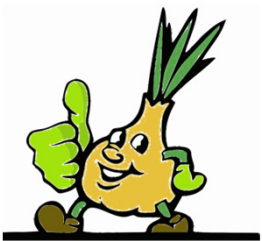
- At the back walkway of the Community Center for any activities or events.

We ask that these only be used should you need to dispose of items between the scheduled trash/recycle collection days. The containers are labelled “TRASH” for trash items and the recycle containers have the green circle indicating recycling.

As always, should you have bigger bulk items such as mattresses, big boxes, piece of furniture, etc., please call the office for removal. Do not place these items at the Community Center or “K” Apartment building.

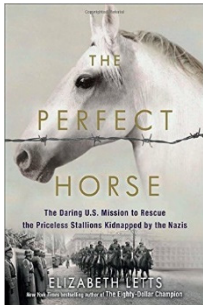
