Pennsylvania Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program

The application deadline for the Pennsylvania Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program application deadline has been extended to December 31, 2019. The program, supported by the Pennsylvania Lottery, benefits eligible State residents age 65 and older, widows and widowers age 50 and older, and people with disabilities age 18 and older. Sanatoga and Buchert Ridge Community residents are classified as "renters" and are eligible to receive an annual rebate check as shown below:

 \$0 - \$8,000

 \$650
 \$8,001-\$15,000

For annual income, only one-half of your social security is considered.

<u>Friday – July 19 – Merchant Square Mall Model Train Exhibit and</u> Museum of Indian Culture

The Merchants Square Model Train Exhibit is one of the most exciting destinations in the Lehigh Valley. It features 36,000 lights, stars, moon and illuminated buildings; a 24' x 16' lake with scale rainfall, thunder and lightning; 40 model trains with subways, elevated trains, pantograph electric trains, steam and diesel trains.; 60-piece operating amusement park and drive-in moving theater; ski area featuring 20 operating ski rides and skating ponds; and over 1,000 structures.

In addition, a tour of the Museum of Indian Culture showcasing the cultural heritage of the Delaware/Lenape Indians and other Northeastern Woodlands tribes. <u>Tuesday – August 27 – Lititz Moravian Church Square Archives & Museum</u>

In the museum you'll find on display musical instruments, paintings and artifacts accumulated over the long history of the Congregation that established Lititz as a church community in 1756.

The Lititz Moravian Church is the centerpiece for the Lititz Historic District. The Church is flanked by the 1759 Single Sisters House (now the Castle of Linden Hall) and the 1759 Single Brothers House commandeered by General Washington as a military hospital in 1777.

The Mission Gift Shop features Moravian Stars, Moravian cookies, handmade beeswax candles and handcrafted jewelry.
