Trash Dumpsters and Recycle Bins

In February, the trash dumpsters and recycle bins at the back of the Community Center and by the "K" Apartment Building will be relocated to the Maintenance Building area. This gives those areas a more pleasant appearance. In addition, it will eliminate the trash truck from driving through the community, hearing the bang of the dumpster as it empties into the truck, scattering of trash on its way out, and leaving a trail of truck fluids.

- Trash and recycle containers will be left at the back walkway of the Community Center for any activities or events.
- Trash and recycle containers will be left in the fenced area by the "K" apartment building.

We ask that these only be used should you need to dispose of items between the scheduled trash/recycle collection days.

As always, should you have bigger bulk items such as mattresses, big boxes, piece of furniture, etc., please call the office for removal. Do not place these items at the Community Center or "K" Apartment building.

Soliciting Policies for the Community and Township

From time to time individuals come into our Communities at various hours throughout the day taking an election survey, putting menus on door knobs, or have stated that they are interested in saving you money on your electric or gas bill.

For your protection and safety, do not let a stranger into your home.

It has always been our policy that there is no soliciting in our Communities. "NO SOLICITING" signs are posted at the entrances. Anyone entering our Communities and handing out menus, employment opportunities, or wanting to speak to you about energy bills, etc. are trespassing.

At the January 2019 Sanatoga Ridge Resident Committee meeting, Lower Pottsgrove Police Chief Mike Foltz stated that while a person soliciting must obtain a permit from the Township, our communities are private and therefore would only be permitted to do so if approved by management. Management does not allow soliciting within our community. Therefore, should you ever be approached by someone soliciting within our communities, do not engage in any conversation, especially inviting them into your home, and call the office or police.

Eagle Scout Project

In our Backyard . . .

Lower Pottsgrove Historical Society

The Lower Pottsgrove Historical Society was founded on September 10, 1985 and headquartered at the Sanatoga Union Sunday School located at 2341 E. High Street. The Sanatoga Union Sunday School began in April 1865 and was original known as Crooked Hill Sunday School. Crooked Hill was the name of the village in which Sanatoga Ridge Community is located.

In 1890, the village name was officially changed to Sanatoga and thus the name change for the Sunday school. The Sunday School was originally held in the Sanatoga Schoolhouse where 96 local children assembled with the first session in 1865. The idea of a Sunday school for children of all denominations in the community gained popularity such that in 1890, a decision was made to build a chapel specifically for religious education of youth of Sanatoga. On Sunday May 10, 1891, the new Sunday school opened.

By the late 20th century, with many local churches providing their own Sunday schools attendance declined significantly. The Historical Society obtained the deed for the Sunday school in March 1991.

To learn more about the history of the Village of Sanatoga and Lower Pottsgrove Township, consider visiting the Lower Pottsgrove Historical Society building at 2341 E. High Street. According to the Historical Society's website, their museum is open to the public for free on the last Sunday of each month from 1 PM to 4 PM. The website also contains a schedule of events including an Open House on Sunday, February 24th from 1 PM to 4 PM.


Resident Committee Meeting
